Sports Events



It has been a very busy half term for sports and as always, our teams have represented us amazingly well!

Events have included a Key Stage 2 Sports Festival at Stonebroom, a boccia tournament – which we won meaning we qualified for the district finals, a 'learn to play boccia festival and a football tournament following successful qualification in the last round.

We have been delighted with the uptake we have had for the Qualitas dance and gym sessions on Thursday evenings. The children seem to be really enjoying them! Next half term, we move on to Dance and are offering the sessions to Class 1 and 2 again. If your child previously had a place at the club, we will assume they will attend after half term.

Homework

We have given lots of thought to homework in school over the years and have weighed up the pros and cons of setting lots of homework. Ultimately, we decided that children need time to relax and enjoy their childhood and that sometimes settings lots of work can be very challenging at home – for children and their grown-ups to fit in! As a result, we made the decision to keep homework to a minimum and only set tasks that we think are essential.

We do notice that the children who regularly complete **reading at home and regular maths activities – including TTR and NumberBots** do make better progress than those children who don't.

Please continue to encourage your child to complete these tasks as regularly as your child's class teacher has set them. It really will make a big difference!

PSHE Topic

This term the children have been learning about money and finances in a whole school PSHE topic called Money Matters. In this topic, we aim to teach children to understand

how much things cost and how people have to manage their income and spending. Higher up in school, children learn about debt, mortgages, loans, credit and interest rates. I'm sure your child will be able to let you know what they have been learning in class.

Lantern Parade

Here is one more reminder that the lantern parade will be taking place this Saturday (2nd December). As our school have made lanterns this year, we will have a place in the parade. Anyone wishing to take part should meet at Bolsover Castle at 4:45pm. Children are encouraged to bring their lanterns with them for the parade.
